Our research delivered authoritative findings

It's vital ACCA's Qualification stays relevant and valued by employers. So we began with qualitative and quantitative research from the 200,000+ ACCA members in the profession's frontline in over 180 countries. We also interviewed employers and partners and surveyed 19,000 members, students and affiliates in order to find out the views of the next generation of finance leaders.

Our investigations delivered authoritative findings on what's driving change in the years to 2025, and the skills tomorrow's finance professionals will need to meet those changes. Our ground-breaking research with ACCA members involved:

Findings: tomorrow's accountants must embrace change

Our research highlighted the need for a qualification that will deliver forward-thinking professionals who are able to use technology to their advantage, combine technical excellence with high ethical standards and management skills, and thrive on a global stage.

While many factors will lead to significant changes in accountancy over the next decade, our research identified these as the four key drivers of change:

- Increased regulation and stronger governance
- Advances in digital technology
- Higher expectations of business value
- Continued globalisation





Findings: tomorrow's accountants need flexible skill-sets

Our findings also showed that to add value for the organisations they serve, tomorrow's accountants will need an optimal and changing combination of professional competencies: a collection of technical knowledge, skills and abilities, combined with interpersonal behaviours and qualities.

We call these 'professional quotients'. They're at the core of the ACCA Qualification.







The seven quotients explained









Technical skills and ethics (TEQ):

The ability to perform consistently well while maintaining the highest standards of integrity, independence and scepticism.

Intelligence (IQ):

The ability to acquire and use knowledge: thinking, reasoning and solving problems.

Creative (CQ):

The ability to use existing knowledge in new situations, to make connections, explore potential outcomes, and generate new ideas.







Digital (DQ):

The awareness and application of existing and emerging digital technologies, capabilities, practices and strategies.

Emotional intelligence

(EQ):The ability to identify personal emotions and those of others, apply them to tasks, and regulate and manage them.

Vision (VQ):

The ability to predict future trends by extrapolating existing trends and facts, and to fill gaps by thinking innovatively.

Experience (XQ):

The ability and skills to understand customer expectations, meet desired outcomes and create value.





Outcome: a qualification setting the standard

The qualification developed with the insight from our research will ensure that ACCA-qualified professionals continue to be the most valued and sought-after across the globe. It sets a standard for the profession to follow.

The main changes to our qualification include:

- A new Strategic Professional level replacing the Professional level
- A new Ethics and Professional Skills module
- New computer-based exams for Applied Skills

The enhancements to the professional level are aligned to a global need to ensure that every qualified accountant not only has the relevant technical skills but also the complementary professional skills to add considerable value within a pressured environment. They will ensure that ACCA accountants are able to drive businesses forward in a rapidly changing environment.

The new Strategic Professional level integrates deep, broad and relevant technical expertise with ethics and professional skills.

The result will be strategically-oriented, forward-thinking professionals equipped with the unique blend of skills needed to hit the ground running and add immediate value for their employers.

Students will be expected to complete this module before attempting any of the Strategic Professional exams.
