1. MINUTES

3. PRESENTATION FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR - GOVERNANCE

The Board noted a presentation from the Executive Director – Governance on recent developments.

4. REPORT FROM THE REGULATIONS REVIEW SUB-COMMITTEE

The Board <u>approved</u> the regulation changes for the 2015 Rulebook, recommended by the Regulations Review Sub-committee.

The Board noted the minutes of the Sub-committee meeting held on 16 July 2014.



5. REGULATORY BOARD WORK PLAN FOR THE COUNCIL YEAR 2014-15

The Board noted the indicative work plan for the 2014-15 Council year.

6. INVESTIGATION AND LISTING TIMES

The Board considered a paper on investigation and listing times and agreed that:

- ACCA should consider whether it would be more cost-effective to outsource cases to overseas firms
- it would like to receive, at a future meeting, some projection figures/a glide path in respect of investigation times of where ACCA expects to be in the future
- it should note that listing times will get worse before they get better
- ACCA should consider holding more pre-hearing meetings in order to reduce the length of large cases
- it would like to receive statistics on the length of time it takes between the time a decision is made and when the reasons are completed

and

 an interim listing time target of six months should be set, which should be reviewed in 12 months' time.

7. LEAD REGULATOR UPDATE

The Board noted an update on ACCA's interactions with its lead regulators and agreed that:

- it would keep the Audit Qualifications matter under review
- consideration should be given to developing a general purpose Regulatory Plan, which should also capture the work that has already been carried out and past learning points

and

 the FRC's clear messages regarding its concerns on audit work should be distilled into a short summary and reinforced to Committee members at the annual training days.



8. REPORT FROM THE APPOINTMENTS SUB-COMMITTEE

The Board noted the minutes of the Sub-committee meeting held on 24 July 2014.

9. BREAKDOWN ON THE NUMBER OF CASES UNDER INVESTIGATION BY AGE OF COMPLAINT

The Board noted a breakdown of the number of cases under investigation by age of complaint.

The Board noted the updated External Deferral policy and agreed that:

 ACCA should consider whether there should be the requirement for some form of independent review to validate the external deferral for cases that have been on External Deferral for a long period of time

and

• the policy should include a statement on the overarching principles driving its development.
